



“Macmillan Caring Locally” formerly *The Macmillan Cancer Trust* was formed in 1974 and evolved from the fund raising committee for the building of the Macmillan Unit at Christchurch Hospital, the first of its kind in the Country. This Committee included amongst its members representatives from the League of Friends at the Royal Victoria Hospital (now Royal Bournemouth and Christchurch Hospital) and the local National Society for Cancer Relief (now Macmillan Cancer Support).

During the final building stages of the Unit it was decided to form a Trust to be identified with the Unit and it was registered as a Charity on 25 July 1974 as "the Macmillan Cancer Trust"

In 2009 the Trust was re-branded as “Macmillan Caring Locally”. The aims of the Charity are to support those who are suffering from Cancer and other terminal diseases where no cure is expected, and to provide help and support for the whole family. Latterly the Charity has aided services which provide early diagnosis of Cancers with a view to enabling early treatment and, ideally, recovery.

“Macmillan Caring Locally” acts as the custodian of all funds donated towards its aims and both initiates and responds to a wide variety of needs supporting the N.H.S., primarily for the Macmillan Unit but also for other Cancer sufferers in South East Dorset and West Hampshire.

£15 Entry Fee to be paid on booking, with minimum sponsorship of £10 to be paid on the day (entries close Wednesday 28th October)

Late/on the day entries £20 with at least £10 sponsorship fee—CASH ONLY on the day.

SPONSORED RIDE

THE COURSE : Approximately 7.5 miles of open farm land and grass tracks with a variety of optional jumps to suit all standards from 2'3 to 3.0'.

PRIZES

Everyone completing the course will receive a rosette.

There will be a prize for the rider with the most money raised, as well as a prize for the most money raised by an under 16 year old. Results will be published by 2pm.

SPONSORSHIP:

Riders must find their own sponsors and obtain the money from them before the day of the event. **ENTRY FEE: £15.00 PER PERSON as well as a minimum sponsorship of £10 each** to be paid in FULL in cash on the day of the event.

START TIMES

Riders will be allocated an hour slot that they can start within, if you have a preferred start time please let us know when you enter. The first slot will be 9:30 and the final slot 2.00—so please ensure if you are entering on the day that you arrive in enough time.

Everyone must be off the course by 4pm!

ON THE DAY:

Please arrive 30 minutes before your start time and book in with the secretary. Here you must pay sponsorship money and collect your number. Hats will also be checked and tagged!

A £5 deposit will be required for hiring number bibs. All will be wearing bibs provided.

This will be refunded on the return of your bib.

It is a condition of acceptance of any entry that every entrant shall indemnify the organisers and landowners against any claim or damage, loss or injury which results directly or indirectly from any action or negligence on their part.

1. All riders must wear hard hats with a fixed harness to a minimum standard of EN1384 1996 / BSEN 1384 1997 with CE mark, PAS015: 1998/ PAS015: 2011 with BSI mark, ASTM F1163: 2004a with SEI mark Or Snell E2001
2. Body protectors are **COMPULSORY** and should be BETA level 3.
3. Riders should also wear a medical armband which must be visible.
4. Riders aged 14 and under must be accompanied on the ride by a responsible and suitably experienced adult.
5. All horses / ponies to be 4 years or over.
6. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure their horse is fit and healthy enough to complete the chosen distance comfortably. Please
7. The horse's passport and a current valid vaccination certificate must be brought on the day otherwise entry may be refused.
8. Instructions of organisers, officials and stewards must be followed to promote the safety of everyone present.
9. For safety reasons, riders to start in groups of at least 2 and no more than 6.
10. Please leave the parking area as you found it—don't muck out your trailer or lorry in the parking area, and take your dung home with you. Thank you!
11. Dogs to be kept on leads at all times
12. Entry fees are a vital part of our fundraising, and are not refundable
13. Every rider must donate at least the minimum before starting
14. Top Prizes will be decided according to the amount of fundraising presented *on the day*, and the result declared at 1pm.
15. Instructions from course marshals must be followed.
16. Passing is allowed, with consideration to other riders.
17. Riders must keep to the field margins and avoid crops
18. Any irresponsible rider will be instructed to leave the course.
19. Young children must be accompanied by an adult throughout the ride.
20. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to any horse/pony which in their opinion is unsound or in unfit condition
21. The ride **MUST NOT** be treated as an xc schooling round, riders are welcome to jump the jumps available but must not be overused.
